indoor and outdoor. There are so many pickleball clubs and groups starting up in every province. There will continue to be great demand for more pickleball courts to accommodate the ever increasing number of players. Some of the recent ones include Parksville Golden Oldies Sports Association (PGOSA) in B.C. They started with 20 players this summer and within 3 weeks they had 86 players. They needed pickleball courts so the City of Parksville marked out six outdoor pickleball courts in the lacrosse box.

Here are some more examples of tennis court conversions to dual purpose:

- 1. Congratulations Linda Brown, Area Ambassador for Salmon Arm BC on the Grand Opening of 4 outdoor pickleball courts at Club Shuswap Golf and RV on Aug. 13 which attracted 140 people when 45-50 were expected.
- 2. The City of Trail BC has designated one tennis court at Butler Park for four pickleball courts.
- 3. The two tennis courts at Westridge Park in Burnaby, B.C. are now lined for 8 pickleball courts.
- 4. The City of Parksville, B.C. has marked out pickleball lines on two tennis courts and six pickleball courts in the lacrosse box.
- 5. Kingsville Tennis Organization in Ontario has recently included pickleball. A group of pickleball volunteers have painted pickleball lines on 4 tennis courts. In the near future, they are proposing a name change to Kingsville Tennis & Pickleball Association. Great to see the cooperation between the pickleball and tennis groups!

There are many more examples across the country, I am mentioning only a few. Thanks to all our Ambassadors and members who work tirelessly behind the scenes increasing the number of courts available, indoor and outdoor, for the ever increasing number of players.

Pickleball in Dartmouth started when a couple of residents of Dartmouth discovered this fascinating game being played a 40 minute drive across the

city in Tantallon. We found out that we loved the game, but disliked the long drive twice a week.

Deciding that this game was worth promoting locally, we got financial support from our local councillor Darren Fisher, and facility support from Peter Wightman, director of the East Dartmouth Community Centre (EDCC). The EDCC group started with 8 dedicated women signing up for 4 Friday mornings, but it quickly grew to up to 25 people of both sexes and various ages playing Monday mornings, Wednesday mornings and evenings, Friday mornings and Sunday afternoons. In June we hosted the Bridgewater pickleball group for exercise and lunch. Our group maintains an e-mail list of over 60 people wanting to be kept up on pickleball activities. For the first time pickleball will be played at the 55+ Games in September and some of the EDCC pickleball participants will be competing.

Canada's Most Southern Town, Kingsville, Ontario

Embraces Pickleball

The Town of Kingsville Ontario is a participant in the Windsor-Essex 100 Mile Peninsula Club, an initiative by surrounding municipalities to convince retirees to relocate to this area. It may come as a surprise therefore, that as of May 01st of 2013, the game of pickleball was not being played anywhere in Kingsville. Indeed, a couple



of initial phone calls revealed that the Kingsville Parks & Rec. Dept. knew nothing of the game, and the local tennis club wanted nothing to do with the game.

In the first week of May, a group of four of us snowbirds started playing pickleball on the Town's tennis courts. We initially used painter's tape to lay out our court markings, but that was too costly and very time consuming. So we quickly changed to homemade reusable rubber strips which also proved to be time consuming and dangerous as players would sometimes trip over the markers. Thankfully no one was seriously injured. Word spread quickly, and soon our numbers doubled, then tripled. We began playing regularly, three mornings a week, picklers neighbouring attracting from

communities. In an effort to lend ourselves credibility, we named our group "Kingsville Pickleball", and created a Facebook page of the same name.

Around mid-June we felt established enough to solicit Town councilors, and the Director

of the Kingsville Parks & Rec. Dept., for permanent pickleball markings to be applied to the tennis courts. During the months of June & July we made three separate presentations to three different committee levels. We told the

panels about the history of Pickleball, why it is so popular, and the benefits it can bring to the Town of Kingsville. We received positive feedback in It also helped that the local each case. newspaper ran an article detailing the growing popularity of Pickleball. The only glitch we confronted was some early opposition to permanent markings by members of the local tennis association, which had exclusionary use of the courts at peak times. The Parks & Recreation Program Manager arranged a meeting between the tennis and pickleball groups. Cognizant of the history that many pickleball groups have had with tennis associations in North America, the Kingsville picklers, lead by a small contingent, went into the meeting expecting a battle. Astonishingly, the tennis association supported the idea of having pickleball lines painted on the tennis courts, and even agreed to pay for the required materials. Wow!!! This must have been a first. Many of the Kingsville Pickleball players ended up joining the tennis association, which perhaps someday may come to be known as the "Kingsville Tennis & Pickleball Association".

On August 3rd of 2013, a group of Kingsville Pickleball members met at the tennis courts

> ready for work. Using chalk lines, painter's tape, and a gallon of 'Traffic Yellow' paint we applied the permanent lines to the four Kingsville tennis courts.

Three hours later we had four new Pickleball

courts! We were tired & dirty, and had just enough energy left to give ourselves a 'highfive'.

(Continued from prev page) ... permanent pickleball markings seems to be bringing out some new players. Recently we had one of our busiest days to date, with all four courts in play, and another four





players waiting in rotation. Serendipitously, on that same day, we were advised that Pickleball will now be included in the official activity guide for the Town of Kingsville. We see great potential for the continued growth of Pickleball in our townand who knows - maybe we'll even get our own T-shirts!

Kingsville is now one of many places to play pickleball in the Windsor/Essex County area. You are sure to get a good & friendly game in Kingsville as there are players of all ages and skill levels.

BC Seniors Games

Over 3700 athletes came to the city of Kamloops to celebrate healthy competition in over 32 different sports, showcasing that age is not a factor in leading an active, healthy life. The BC Seniors Games is an annual event (26 years) held by the BC Senior Games Society, who promote a healthy, active lifestyle at the community level for all 55+ aged residents of BC. The sport of pickleball is a relatively new addition to the Games (2009) and continues to draw curious spectators and much exposure in both print and on television. Skill ratings were used for the first time and games played over 3 days at the South Kamloops Secondary gyms. In 2012 there were 94 pickleball players registered and this year 154 players were registered. Pickleball players wish to thank the City of Kamloops for hosting the games, the BC Seniors Games Society for organizing and giving us this opportunity and the Province of BC through the Ministry of Community, Sport and Cultural Development for financial support. 

Question:

In a doubles match, the server hit his serve over

the net and hit the receiver's partner before the ball touched the ground. The ball would clearly have gone out if it had not hit the receiver's partner. The receiver wanted a re-serve. Is that the correct procedure?

Answer:

No. The server wins the point.

Refer to IFP Rules Section 7 Fault Rules.

Part of 7.F. <u>In</u> doubles, if the serve strikes the receiver's partner, it is a point for theserving team, providing it is not a let serve or a fault serve.

This rule also includes balls that appear to be hit out of bounds: during play, if you catch the ball or try to stop it from heading out of bounds, you lose the rally.

Know the rules. You will become a better player!
