Introduction: National Pickleball Day



Pickleball is the fastest-growing sport in Canada, with over 1.37 million Canadians playing at least once a month. It's a fun, inclusive, and rewarding activity that brings people of all ages together—making it the perfect sport for families to enjoy.

Pickleball Canada is proud to represent more than 80,000 members nationwide, supported by 11 Provincial and Territorial associations. As interest in the game continues to rise across the country, our community keeps growing stronger.

To celebrate this momentum, the second Saturday in August has been officially recognized as National Pickleball Day—a day to honour and promote the sport that connects us all. In 2026, National Pickleball Day will be held on Saturday, August 8.

This toolkit has been created to help you celebrate in your own way. Inside, you'll find logos, frames, and creative ideas to help you spread the word and show your pickleball pride.

We invite you to celebrate National Pickleball Day however it works best for you. Take photos and videos, and share your excitement with your community and with us at Pickleball Canada. Feel free to use logo and frames to help promote your events and activities.

How to Take part



Provincial and Territorial Associations

Recognize National Pickleball Day by encouraging your clubs to organize something on Saturday, August 8 that will create awareness of pickleball and/or introduce the game to potential players. You can use the items included in this toolkit or create your own promotional materials using the National Pickleball Day logo to let your members know August 8 is more than any other day on the courts.

Clubs

Include National Pickleball Day on your club event calendar! If you already have programming scheduled for Saturday, August 9, make sure to spread the word of the special occasion to your members and consider including National Pickleball Day promotion in the planned programming.

If you don't yet have programming planned for National Pickleball Day, consider planning learn-to-play sessions to attract new members in your communities or get your current members together for some fun matches, practices, or skills sessions to celebrate the day.

Here are some ideas of events you could organize in your club or community:

How to Take part



Spread the Word

Promote your event via social media, newsletters, posters, flyers, local media, etc. Include #NationalPickleballDay when you post on social media so we can see and share your pictures, videos, and promotions.

Some suggested channels:

- Promote National Pickleball Day on your website. If you create a specific page, be sure to have reference to it on your home page
- Social Media posts (don't forget to include #NationalPickleballDay)
- Write an article for your local printed magazines and include an invitation to take part
- Ask your facility to include information on your event in their newsletters
- Include information on your event below your email signature block
- Send invitations directly to people on your membership database
- Display posters in your venue and other local venues visited by potential players, such as shops, libraries, gyms, and community centres
- Send a press release to your local media including newspapers, radio stations, and TV stations to let them know about your event

National Pickleball Day 2022

Fredericton, New Brunswick

The Fredericton Pickleball Club celebrated National Pickleball Day with 5 hours of outdoor fun league play in beautiful weather.

Vaudreuil-Dorion, Quebec

The Vaudreuil-Dorion Pickleball Club hosted a successful initiation event with 32 new players registered. The club used four courts to teach new players the game, while on another four courts members demonstrated the sport and paired up with newly initiated players.

Grand Bend, Ontario

One and a half years ago, Dave Tomlinson's group started with 6 players outside on a seldom used municipal basketball court. On National Pickleball Day, 31 attending players spent the day on that same court, now 3 pickleball courts, that had a \$20,000 facelift. The group continues to lobby for more courts, demonstrating the increasing demand for pickleball in their community.



National Pickleball Day 2023

Powell River, British Columbia

A group which formed in 2020 by Barb Struch who organized a learn-to-play program for seniors in the area hosted a reunion for the group. There were dinking games, court play, two barbecues during this event.

Miltonvale, Prince Edward Island

In Miltonvale they celebrated National Pickleball Day with a fun tournament. There were two categories, recreational and advanced. For a number of the players in the recreational category it was their first-time experiencing tournament play. There was a hotdog/ hamburger barbecue lunch between the categories. It was a good time had by all!

St. Thomas, Ontario

The St. Thomas Pickleball Club posted signs at their outdoor courts inviting any and all to try pickleball. They mixed up club members and non-club players to create the social/fun side of the game.

Medicine Hat, Alberta

The Medicine Hat Pickleball Club hosted an Under the Lights Play at their club. They started the evening singing O Canada to honour National Pickleball Day. Their President made a few announcements and then they all drew numbers from 1-16 out of a hat. The women drew first in the order that they had signed up. Then the men drew numbers from 1-16 and that is how they determined partners. Play was sportsmanlike but competitive! Everyone brought a shareable snack and a beverage of choice for after the play was done and they had a great 70s and 80s music playlist to make it even more fun.

Alma, Quebec

The Alma Pickleball Club was very proud to participate in National Pickleball Day for the third consecutive year. The team at Alma Pickleball Club initiated around 20 new recruits during the event. They are more than happy to be added to the club's current 350 members.

This year, we took our players on a trip back to 1965 to mark not only Canada's National Pickleball Day, but also the 60th anniversary of the sport's invention. Each player enjoyed a game using classic wooden paddles—just like they did when pickleball first began. We wrapped up the day with a delicious corn boil and other fun games, making it a celebration to remember.

As the background of the frame is transparent, your image will show through. The frame works best when layered over a square image of a similar size.
