
National Pickleball Day

Dynamic Universal Pickleball Rating (DUPR)

On September 10, 2025, Pickleball Canada officially adopted the Dynamic Universal Pickleball Rating (DUPR) as our national rating system. This decision followed a thorough review of the Canadian Tournament Player Rating (CTPR), incorporating feedback from members, Tournament Directors, and Provincial and Territorial Sport Organizations (PTSOs).

The review concluded that, with the evolution of DUPR as a universal system, national rating systems like the CTPR are no longer necessary. By adopting DUPR, Pickleball Canada joins a growing global network of federations, clubs, and leagues, helping to standardize ratings worldwide and strengthen the future of our sport through greater connection, consistency, and fairness.
